Dear Council Member Ward,

I am among the shoreline property owners who strongly support improved shoreline and near shore habitat protection. My concern is that the continued degradation of the shore and marine environment is robbing me, my children, my grandchildren and all those living on the island of a healthy environment as well as the pleasures our beaches provide. We are also having an adverse effect on plants and animals who share space with us

I have visited my family's shoreline property regularly since the late 1940's and have lived on the property for the last 15 years. As an avid snorkeler, I have seen with my own eyes the continued degradation of our near shore environment. Water clarity has diminished radically, marine plants and animals I used to see regularly are no longer present, and our beaches are cluttered with trash.
