Dear Council Members,

As you enter the final phase of the SMP update I hope you will listen carefully to the concerns of shoreline property owners and **address** those concerns in revisions to the draft.

As I have stated in previous comments, we are the most affected by these regulations and have not been adequately represented by the city staff, planning commission and a majority of the Council during the SMP development.

Early in my career I attended a course by H. and A. Bleiker on how to achieve community acceptance for controversial projects. This is a process where projects or actions are planned for and implemented in a manner that adequately addresses the concerns of all of the "sides".
