I would like a minute of your time to relate the 1996 SMP City Council Decision regarding Point Monroe Lagoon and Aquatic Conservancy Designation. During the writing of the 1996 SMP it was recommended that the lagoon be designated an aquatic conservancy. After the City Council reviewed the criteria for Aquatic Conservancy it was determined that the designation of aquatic conservancy should only exist in a small area on the south end where there are no homes. The remainder of the lagoon is very densely populated with homeowners that are conscientious stewards. Aquatic Conservancy is a designation for an unpopulated area that is used to protect a habitat that is used by fish for procreation or protection of endangered plant or aquatic species. The lagoon has no streams running into it and nearly empties with each low tide. It has no sea grass nor endangered species or plant life.

The ironic thing is that it is not the people, homes, docks, or boats that are destroying the lagoon. It is the City's Culvert that empties directly into the current designated aquatic conservancy that is destroying the lagoon. It pours thousands and thousands of gallons of sludge, road runoff, and pollutants directly into the lagoon. It is filling the lagoon with sludge that is smothering the sea life and plants. It is only a matter of time until the City Culvert kills the lagoon like it has many parts of Fletcher Bay.

Please take the time to carefully examine the definition of Aquatic Conservancy. I am certain that you will come to the conclusion that it is inappropriate for the Point Monroe Lagoon. And please make eradicating the devastating pollution created by the City Culverts a priority.
