

NARRATIVE

On 02/19/2025, at approximately 1025 hours, I was dispatched by CENCOM to the intersection of Hwy 305 and Adas Will Rd for a report of a motor vehicle collision. Initial report was that 2 vehicles collided with a tree.

I arrived at approximately 1035 hours and observed 1 vehicle, pulled over to the side of the road with the rear window broken out of it. I also observed a large tree off to the east side of the road. The tree appeared out of the road, but there still was a large amount of tree debris across the roadway. A state DOT truck was already on scene and getting ready to cut up the tree and clear the remainder of the road.

A Bainbridge Island Fire Department firefighter contacted me and advised me there was just one vehicle involved, the driver was uninjured and in the back of the ambulance on scene. I contacted Driver 1 in the back of Aid 23. Driver 1 stated to me that she was driving southbound on Hwy 305, approaching the roadabout. Driver 1 stated the traffic was moving very slow. Driver 1 stated that she heard a crashing noise, looked to her left and observed a tree falling down. Driver 1 stated she thought the tree was going to fall behind her, but ended up colliding with the roof and rear window of her car. Driver 1 stated she then pulled over to the side of the road.

Driver 1 was uninjured. The vehicle was still driveable so I instructed Driver 1 to park the vehicle on Adas Will Rd to get it off the highway. I followed Driver 1 over to Adas Will. I provided Driver 1 with a copy of her exchange. Driver 1 stated she would arrange her own tow and remained with her vehicle.
