

## NARRATIVE

On 01/25/2022 at approximately 1500 hours, I was dispatched by CENCOM to Winslow Way E/Bjune DR SE regarding a vehicle versus pedestrian accident.

Upon arrival at scene, the pedestrian was approximately 37.5 feet from the intersection of where witnesses later placed her, lying in the middle of the roadway on Bjune DR SE. The pedestrian told officers her back was hurting and tingling. She was walking eastbound on Winslow way E. Once at the intersection of Bjune DR SE, she attempted to cross the street using the pedestrian cross walk and was struck by Driver 1. Bainbridge Island Fire Department (BIPD) M21 arrived on scene and treated the pedestrian. BIPD M21 transported the pedestrian to Saint Michael's Medical Center for further evaluation.

I contacted Driver 1. Driver 1 stated he was driving westbound on Winslow way E from the ferry with his wife. They did not have any injuries. When he got to the intersection of Bjune DR SE, he stopped and put his blinker on to turn left onto Bjune DR SE. There was a white truck stopped in the opposite lane facing eastbound at the intersection of Winslow way E/Bjune DR SE with their right blinker on waiting to turn right on Bjune DR SE. He thought the truck was stopped and not turning because he was allowing him to turn in first. He made the left turn and struck the pedestrian in the middle of the southbound lane of Bjune DR SE in the cross walk. The pedestrian flipped up on his hood and he carried her a short distance before being able to get to a complete stop. He was driving approximately 5 miles per hour and he did not see the pedestrian in the crosswalk because the sun was right in his face. He really thought the vehicle in the opposite lane was just waiting for him to turn in and did not think it was because a pedestrian was in the crosswalk. He said there was no damage to his vehicle and asked if the pedestrian was ok. I explained to Driver 1 he would be receiving a ticket in the mail and he stated he understood. I provided Driver 1 a business card with the case number.
