

NARRATIVE

On 9/20/2022 at approximately 1523 hours the officer was dispatched to an injury motor vehicle collision at State Highway 305 and NE Day Road.

The officer arrived on scene where the collision was actually on State Highway 305 a couple hundred feet north of NE Day Rd near the 13400 block.

Officer observed vehicle two and identified the driver. Vehicle two had extensive damage to the rear portion and rear bumper. BIFD was on scene and later began to evaluate the passenger of vehicle two who was complaining of neck and back pain and was transported to Saint Michael's Medical Center shortly after.

Officer spoke with the driver of vehicle two who explained that the driver of vehicle one had departed the scene after exchanging information. She showed the officer photographs on her phone of vehicle one. The only damage on the vehicle noted by the officer was that the front license plate had been slightly bent inward. She also had a photograph of the other driver's license. She also had a photograph of his insurance and policy number. She stated that he told her he did not see her turn signal and did not give him enough time to react. She explained that she tested her turn signals and that both were working.

The driver of vehicle two explained that she was traveling northwest bound on State Highway 305 just past NE Day Rd and was attempting to turn into a driveway on the left-hand side. She advised that she got rear-ended before starting to turn and her vehicle was pushed forward near the location where they pulled off the roadway.

The only witness to the collision was identified and advised the officer that it appeared vehicle two was attempting to pull into a driveway and was then rear-ended by vehicle one.

The officer later spoke over the phone with the driver of vehicle one who advised that he was traveling northwest bound on State Highway 305 behind vehicle two. He noted that vehicle two seemed to be looking for somewhere to turn but were unsure of where they were going. He stated that he did not recall seeing her turn signal before hitting her vehicle.
