and SR 305. Dispatch advised that an unknown male bicyclist was unconscious, bleeding from head and mouth, with slow breathing.

I arrived on scene with Cpl. Kazer and observed several people standing around an unknown male

On 08/01/23, at approximately 1642 hours, I was dispatched to a CPR in progress call at Vineyard

who was wiping blood from his head, with Cpl. Fastaia standing next to the unknown male talking to him. Cpl. Kazer and I contacted the male and attempted to get the unknown male to sit down, later identified as to sit down several times, with push just looking at me. needed assistance standing before aid arrived.

I spoke with 3 witnesses. From the witnesses statements, it appears that

Bainbridge Island Ferry terminal on his E-Bike heading northbound on the Olympic Trail adjacent to SR 305. Sometime during his ride he hit a concrete structure just off the side of the walkway, causing

his tire to come off and falling off his bike. Witness, stated that she was driving southbound on SR 305 and observed a male on a bike with the bike's front tire "Flying off", and pulled over to assist the male.

Witness stated he was next to and his bike on the Ferry from Seattle and stopped to see if the medded help, but did not see the accident. Witness stated that

was unconscious for at least 2 minutes after the accident and that told her his name was . The name was later confirmed with a workers ID badge from backpack. It black backpack went with Aid to St. Michaels Medical Center, with

Cpl. Kazer and I looked at the scene and observed a low leveled concrete structure just off the side of the walkway, between SR 305 and the walkway. Cpl. Kazer showed me what appeared to be skid marks, and what appeared to be a large scratch mark on the front tire. This lead Cpl. Kazer and I to believe that

off the bike. I took pictures of the scene and uploaded them to evidence.com

Cpl. fastaia retrieved the front tire from bike approximately 100 feet northbound of and his bike. Cpl. Kazer and I loaded the bike into my marked patrol vehicle and processed the bike for safekeeping at Bainbridge Island Police Department.
