

NARRATIVE

On 8-24-2023 at approximately 1826 hours I was dispatched to a non-injury motor vehicle collision at the lower Town and Country Parking Lot located at 343 Winslow Way E. CENCOM advised that a white [REDACTED] (vehicle one) bearing WA plate: [REDACTED] had hit a parked vehicle and they believed the driver was potentially intoxicated.

The parked vehicle was a blue [REDACTED] (vehicle two) bearing WA plate: [REDACTED]. I arrived on scene with Officer Miller #814 and contacted the driver of vehicle one identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was upset by another male on scene who had taken his keys away from him. This Subject was identified as [REDACTED] who explained to me that he was concerned [REDACTED] was intoxicated and did not want him to drive away. [REDACTED] provided me with [REDACTED] keys.

Vehicle one was parked in the lower lot of Town and Country near Bjune Dr SE right next to vehicle two. Vehicle two was legally parked and within the parking lines in the parking space it was in. However vehicle one's passenger side was in vehicle two's parking space and had clearly made contact with the rear driver's side bumper of vehicle two. I noted damage to vehicle two's driver's side bumper, mostly white paint transfer.

I noted that we had received a previous 911 call of Reckless driving on State Highway 305 and Sportsman's Club, and then near Ordway Elementary School, and that the vehicle and plate given was [REDACTED] truck. [REDACTED] denied driving in these areas. I asked [REDACTED] if he had anything to drink today, he stated that he did not and that he does not drink. I did NOT detect any odor of alcoholic beverage coming from [REDACTED] person and could note any other obvious signs of impairment. [REDACTED] agreed to perform voluntary Standard Fields Sobriety Tests with Officer Miller so that we could evaluate if it was safe for him to drive.

I then spoke with one of the witnesses on scene identified as [REDACTED] who stated that she was standing next to her vehicle in the parking spaces directly across from the collision. She stated that she heard a loud crunch and then came over to vehicle one where [REDACTED] was in the passenger seat on the phone leaned over the steering wheel. [REDACTED] advised that he did not witness the collision.

The driver of vehicle two, [REDACTED], came outside after shopping inside Town and Country and was notified that her vehicle was hit. Officer Miller advised me that [REDACTED] did not appear to be impaired or under the influence of anything. [REDACTED] noted that he was very tired and had several medical issues he was dealing with such as high blood pressure. [REDACTED] stated that he did not think he had hit vehicle two.
