

NARRATIVE

On August 25, 2023 at approximately 1248 hours, I was dispatched to an unknown injury, motor vehicle collision involving multiple vehicle, located on State Highway 305 just South of Day Rd on Bainbridge Island, WA.

I arrived on scene and saw Unit 1, a blue, [REDACTED] with WA license plate [REDACTED], in a ditch facing Southbound in the Northbound Lane of traffic. The driver of Unit 1 was being checked out by the Aid crew and appeared to be confused. I asked the driver of Unit 1 what happened, and they told me they were headed to work, travelling Southbound on State Highway 305, when they just blacked out, and woke up in the ditch. It was later learned the driver of Unit 1 suffered a medical emergency and possibly blacked out/ fell asleep at the wheel.

Approximately 200-300 feet up the roadway, Unit 3, a white, [REDACTED] with WA license plate [REDACTED], was partially blocking the Northbound Lane of traffic. I observed extensive damage to the driver side of the vehicle. The driver of Unit 3 was in the back of an Aid car about to be transported to St. Michael's Medical Center for precautionary reasons. I spoke to the driver of Unit 3 and asked what happened. They told me they were traveling Northbound on State Highway 305 when they saw the white box truck (Unit 2), in front of them swerve. Unit 3 decided to swerve as well and saw Unit 1 coming towards them and ultimately making contact. Unit 1 went into the ditch, and continued to travel Southbound until it made its final resting stop approximately 200-300 feet South of initial impact.

I went and spoke to the driver and passenger of Unit 2. Unit 2 was a white, [REDACTED] box van with WA license plate [REDACTED]. The driver told me they were travelling Northbound on State Highway 305, when they observed Unit 1, who was travelling Southbound, start to turn in to their lane. The driver of Unit 2 said the driver of Unit 1 appeared to be asleep. The driver of Unit 2 swerved and Unit 1 made impact with the driver side, rear corner of Unit 2 before making contact with Unit 3.

No parties involved sustained visible injuries.

Unit 1 was later voluntarily transported to St. Michael's Medical Center.

Unit 3 was transported to St. Michael's Medical Center for precautionary reasons.

Unit 1 sustained extensive damage to the front end of the vehicle.

Unit 2 sustained minor damage to the driver side, rear corner of the vehicle.

Unit 3 sustained extensive damage to the driver side of the vehicle.
