I interviewed an additional witness on scene, who had observed was, Vehicle 1, driving on the northern shoulder of Wyatt Way while heading westbound on Wyatt Way approaching Finch Rd. then stated that he observed Vehicle 1 drive back onto the roadway as they approached the intersection of Wyatt Way and Finch Rd, ultimately colliding with her driver's side into the driver's side of Vehicle 2, a dark green Lexus (WA plate was).

Corporal Lewis (#809) had interviewed about what had happened on scene and she had described the very same scenario that had been described by

had a copy of her insurance in her vehicle that showed it was recently expired as of February 2024. was transported by aid from the scene before a ctation could be issued, and so a citation for operating her vehicle without valid insurance has been issued to be sent to her via mail.

It should also be noted that seems 's vehicle had been called in earlier in the day for a Hit and Run that had occurred in Bremerton, WA involving the vehicle backing into and causing minor damage to a neighbor's vehicle. The notes from that Bremerton call from the reporting party indicated that he had asked the driver, described as an older female, if she was okay and that she had only nodded her head before driving off. The reporting party had mentioned in the call that they believed that the collision may have been "because of her age" and that "she doesn't see the road."

's vehicle had also been called in on Bainbridge Island at approximately 13:57 later that day after driving over a curb near the intersection of Sportsman Club Rd and Wardwell Ln but was unable to be located by Officers during that time.

Due to all of the above circumstances, it appears that did not cause any of the collisions with criminal intent and that a driver's re-evaluation in conjunction with the insurance citation would be the more appropriate course of action. The driver's retest form was submitted to DOL.
