Bainbridge Island Police Department officer Ryan Norton arrived before me and contacted the driver, and soul occupant of the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle, later identified as trying to locate the registration for the vehicle at the request of officer Norton. Officer Norton asked

me to stand by while he returned to his marked patrol vehicle, and I asked for his insurance information. During both requests rummaged through the glove box and scanned over the same documents reading them out loud several times. The requested documents were never produced.

PBT showed that was nearly double a 08. Please see Officer Norton's DUI report. An examination of the scene and the position of the car in its final position of rest led me to believe that the car was traveling southbound on Rockaway beach and attempted to make a right hand 90° curve at the South end of that street. The car appeared to cross the center line, go over the oncoming lane onto the shoulder and then proceed westbound striking a stairs, leading to the property owners' home, a planter at the top of the stairs, and two pieces of quarried stone that were due to be installed the following day.
