

On 8-23-24 I was dispatched to a hit and run motor vehicle collision at the parking lot across from Doc's Marina Bar and Grill located at 403 Madison Ave S.

The reporting party and witness [REDACTED], advised that she observed the suspect vehicle, a white 2014 Volkswagen Jetta bearing WA plate: [REDACTED] (vehicle 1) back into another vehicle and then depart the area.

I called [REDACTED] who stated that vehicle 1 was parked on the driver's side of the victim's vehicle, a grey 2015 Honda Civic (unoccupied, vehicle 2). She stated that the female driver backed out of her parking space and began to turn too soon causing her passenger side to hit the rear driver's side of vehicle 2.

[REDACTED] stated that the female exited the vehicle looked at the damage but did not appear to leave any information before driving off.

[REDACTED] sent me a photograph of both vehicles in the parking lot and the female driver out of the vehicle. From the photograph it appeared vehicle 2 had reportable damage to the rear driver's side bumper. The female driver appeared to be caucasian, tall, heavy set with long blonde hair. The photograph was uploaded to evidence.com.

The registered owner of vehicle 1 came back as a [REDACTED] with a Kingston address. I contacted the owner, [REDACTED], of vehicle 2. [REDACTED] was not on scene and stated that this son was driving the vehicle because he works at Doc's.

[REDACTED] stated that he would like to just exchange information with the other driver and did NOT want to pursue charges for hit and run.

I requested a North KCSO Deputy go to vehicle 1's address in Kingston and have them call me. I was later given the phone number for the driver, identified as [REDACTED]. I was advised that [REDACTED] is [REDACTED]'s daughter and was using her vehicle.

I called [REDACTED] who stated that her friend inside the vehicle was distracting her while she backing out. She recalled feeling a "bump" but thought it was something in the road. She stated that she got out and looked at the vehicles but didn't think she could see anything.

I advised her that the owner of the other vehicle wished only to exchange information and not press charges for hit and run, and that in the future she needs to make an effort to leave information or call 911. [REDACTED] was apologetic and stated that she understood. I provided [REDACTED] with [REDACTED]'s phone number (with his permission) so that they could discuss the matter of the exchange of info.

I went to the location of vehicle 2 and took photographs of the vehicle, where [REDACTED] was now on scene with his son. [REDACTED] had already provided their insurance information which was passed on to [REDACTED].

On 8-25-2024 I requested [REDACTED] send me photographs of her vehicle as I had not yet seen the damage. In the photographs it appeared there may be minor damage to the rear passenger side, but it was difficult to see much from the photos.
